Jesus, Thank You for Loving Me! Thank You for Saving Me! Thank You for Keeping Me!



Shiloh's Diaconate

Embodying God's mercy to those in need

Thankful!

I am thankful for Shiloh's Diaconate Ministry—the Pastoral Care Team that comes along side of me every day to work with me in caring for the members of our church. These are our deacons and deaconesses. We are striving to help every member understand how we provide care here at Shiloh. The Pastoral Care Team's role supplements the care that already exists within the church and is one of listening, helping, praying, coming alongside and encouraging from the Bible. There is access to more specialized help should it be required. It's important to understand that the role of the diaconate care team is not to forever providing a listening ear or assistance but it's geared to help members to move on further with their relationship with God.

GETTING HELP: REQUESTING DIACONATE CARE

The Diaconate serves those in crisis or in challenging situations within the Shiloh congregation only. If you are in need of practical help, please call the Diaconate Family Support Helpline listed below, and the deacon or deaconess on call will return your call within 36 hours. You will be asked some basic questions that we ask everyone who calls for assistance so that we can assess how to best help. The information you share with us will be kept confidential. Please keep in mind, due to limited resources, the Diaconate cannot take on all requests for assistance. Our purpose is to show God's love and mercy by trying to help people out of difficult circumstances and to be facilitators of the work God is doing in their lives. We offer practical help in a number of ways, including helping the member get connected with available resources, assisting with counseling, helping with budgeting, providing emotional and spiritual support, and financial assistance for basic living expenses (rent, food, utilities, medical, etc.)

- 1. Contact Us: Call the Diaconate Family Support Helpline: 907.276.6640
- 2. **Assessment:** The Family Support leadership will determines your eligibility for care based on a list of criteria (such as Shiloh affiliation, type of need, and asset information).
- 3. **Getting Care:** Family Support leadership will contact your assigned deacon/deaconess if your request is eligible for Diaconate care. Our goal is to partner with you and see your situation change over time until you no longer need our assistance. This partnership is a two-way street. We expect you to be honest with us and to make full disclosure of your situation. You can expect us to strive to understand you, encourage and love you in Christ, provide for your basic needs when appropriate, and pray for and with you.

Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. **Do I have to be a member to receive help?** Yes, Shiloh must be your home church.
- 2. How many people will know about my situation?

The Diaconate adheres to a strict confidentiality policy. Only the Diaconate staff as well as the deacons or deaconesses working with you will know your identity. In addition, no one who does not need to know the details of your situation will be told about them. With a client's prior written approval, some information may be exchanged between his or her deacons or deaconesses and others who are critical to providing care for him or her, such as a counselor or a Community Group leader. The Diaconate will share necessary information discreetly to the parties involved.

3. How often will I meet with my deacons or deaconesses?


The frequency of meeting depends on various factors such as the nature of your situation and your financial, emotional or spiritual needs. It can range from once a week to once a month or even once a quarter. There will be phone and email contact as well.

4. Who do I contact if I have disagreements with my deacons or deaconesses?

If you find yourself in conflict with your deacon or deaconess, the Diaconate recommends what Jesus says in Matthew 18: "If your brother sins against you, go and show him his fault, just between the two of you." We ask that members communicate directly with their deacons or deaconesses about concerns they may be having about their interactions with their deacons or deaconesses. If, however, after you have tried to communicate with them and are not satisfied with the outcome, you may take the next step of Matthew 18 by calling the Diaconate Leadership Team at 907.276.6673.












