CELEBRATING THREE DEFINING ERAS OF MINISTRY

SHILOH FOUNDING YEARS [1952 -1970]

Founding Pastor: Reverend John Holidav

This was the beginning era for Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church. Reverend John Holiday, the first Pastor, along with 30 plus charter members organized the church in 1952; Pastor Holiday served for approximately 2 years; there were 9 pastors and/or interim pastors during the first 18 years of SMBC's Ministry, with Reverend Shedrick Griggs, the last pastor for this 18 year era, serving the longest—approximately 4 years. The Pastors and growing membership of this era built the first Shiloh church building in downtown Anchorage on 8th Avenue. We don't have a comprehensive written history about the ministry for this era, but there is a rich oral history of these early years which is still shared by individuals who were members of Shiloh then and who are members now. In 1970 Pastor Alonzo B. Patterson was called as Shiloh's Pastor following the untimely death of Pastor Griggs. TODAY WE CELEBRATE AND THANK GOD FOR OUR FOUNDERS!

SHILOH BUILDING YEARS [1970 - 2017] Pastor: The Reverend Dr. Alonzo B. Patterson

This was the building and growth era for Shiloh. Pastor Patterson designed and built Shiloh's current facilities; Shiloh's membership grew to 1000 plus members; Pastor Patterson implemented a strategic plan for ministry development using the 1-5-4 Principles of Church Growth that resulted in clearly defined and fully functioning ministries in Worship, Membership Care, Discipleship, Ministry, Evangelism and Administration and Church Support; he acquired a staff consisting of 7.5 fulltime employees to oversee the daily operations of these ministries; under his leadership Shiloh's budget increased 400%; Pastor Patterson trained many leaders for ministry, licensing and ordaining more than 60 ministers, ordaining even more diaconate ministers, and training and mentoring leaders for every ministry; he led Shiloh into the technological era when technology was unheard of in churches and Shilod continued an amazing advancement in technology through today.he founded two community development corporations Shiloh Community Development, Inc.(SCDI and Shiloh Community Housing, Inc. SCHI) to addraess the economic, education, affordable housing, of under resourced people in our community; Pastor Patterson led Shiloh in planting new churches in Eagle River, Palmer and Fairbanks, AK; TODAY WE CELEBRATE AND THANK GOD FOR OUR BUILDERS!

SHILOH TRANSITIONING FORWARD YEARS [2017-2022]

Pastor: Reverend Undra Parker, MDiv.

This is Shiloh's transitioning forward era. Pastor Parker assumed the mantle of Pastoral leadership in a historical transition secession in 2017; just as he was beginning his movement forward with the 1-5-4 Principles and Plan—the COVID-19 Pandemic happened and brought Shiloh to a momentary standstill. Pastor Parker was faced with leading Shiloh in and through the most difficult years in the church's history! He moved quickly to educate himself about the Pandemic and immediately began structuring a plan to keep Shiloh together as one and to keep the church moving forward. This was not an easy task! SHILOH TOGATHER was born. This plan included on-line devotions every morning by Shiloh members; streaming worship services every Sunday; on-line Bible Study and prayer, new Community Care Groups for every family member-adults, youth, and children, Drive thru's for everything we needed to provide for our membership; intensive membership care, and continued missions outreach to those in need in our community AND ZOOM! ZOOM! And more ZOOM to continue our work! weren't always present but we were always TOGETHER—SHILOH MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH! THANK YOU PASTOR UNDRA PARKER! WE CELEBRATE AND THANK GOD THIS DAY FOR OUR FUTURE! WE ARE SHILOH!

We genuinely appreciate God for leading us by His Spirit to our church and what He has gifted in us, individually and collectively, as a ministry.

Finally, I would like to **THANK** every church member for your share. If you have contributed to the work of the ministry in any way over the last 70 years, know that your share was necessary, sufficient, and fundamental. I **APPRECIATE** all those saints who have gone home to be with the Lord but whose impact on the ministry was invaluable. I am forever grateful for our Pastor Emeritus, Rev. Dr. Alonzo B. Patterson, who, by his Spirit-filled life, has brought us to this place of being a pillar in the Anchorage community. To all our you for living a productive life, raising the productivity of those around you, and leaving a deposit for many generations.

I hope you thoroughly enjoy our 70th Anniversary activities and services, reflecting on God's goodness and grace in your life and our ministry. I think that the future of the Church is bright. It's a matter of our continuing to stay together, of our continuing to understand that we are the body of Christ and that Christ is the head of the Church and that we move by His Spirit and His guidance. As long as we keep Him in the forefront of our vision and allow Him to guide and structure and shape our vision, I think we will be the Church that He wants us to be. To God Be the Glory for the Great Things He Has, Is, and Will be Done!



Reverend Dr. Christopher Alan Bullock Pastor, Canaan Baptist Church New Castle, DE

Christopher Alan Bullock is a native of Wichita, Kansas with roots in Arkadelphia, Arkansas. He is the Founder and Pastor of the Canaan Baptist Church of Delaware. He has presided over one of the most effective urban ministry models for church planting and growth in America. In November 2012, Dr. Bullock was overwhelmingly elected as the first African American President of New Castle County Council. He is the former Chairman of the Delaware Black Caucus, and a former member of the Board of Directors of the National Baptist Convention USA, Inc.

From 1998 to 2004, Dr. Bullock served as Pastor of The Historic Progressive Baptist Church of Chicago, Illinois. He was elected as the activist president of the Chicago Southside Branch of the NAACP. The branch experienced measurable membership growth and effectively addressed social justice and civil rights issues in Chicago. Dr. Bullock also served as an Illinois State Commissioner on Discrimination and Hate Crimes.

During the period of 1990 to 1998, he served as Pastor of The Historic Eighth Street Baptist Church of Wilmington Delaware. During his tenure, the congregation experienced phenomenal ministry growth. As a result of this success, Dr. Bullock relocated the congregation to a multimillion dollar, newly constructed sanctuary, and facility. He served as a Delaware State Commissioner on Minority Health, and Delaware State Commissioner on Public Integrity. He has been honored by many local, national, and international organizations for his work and ministry, and is the author of two books, "The Social Mission of the Black Church: A Call to Action" and "A Charge to Keep."

He earned the Doctor of Ministry degree from the United Theological Seminary and completed his post-doctoral work at Harvard University Divinity School. Additionally, he earned the Master of Divinity degree from the Colgate-Rochester Divinity School/Crozer Seminary, and Bachelor of Social Work degree from the University of Alaska-Anchorage.

He shares marriage and ministry with his wife of 34 years, Dr. Debbie Strickling-Bullock. They have two sons, Benjamin and Daniel, and are the proud grand-parents of Daniel Christopher Bullock, Isaiah Benjamin Bullock, and Isabella Joenelle Bullock.
